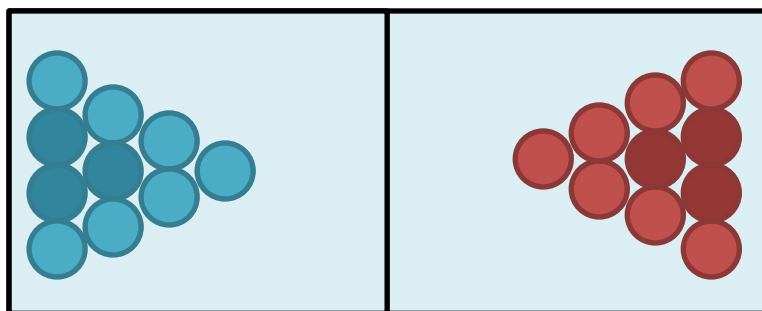

Teaching notes

1. Before the lesson add a set of questions to the cards then copy and cut up.
2. Equipment per team (team size 3-4 students)
 - 10 question/forfeit cards
 - 10 paper cups
 - 1 ping pong ball
3. Ask each team to arrange their cups facing each other as below:



4. Put a question/forfeit card in each cup.
5. The teams then take it in turns to throw a ping pong ball into their opponents' cups.
6. When a ball lands in a cup, the throwing team answers the question in the cup.
7. If they can't answer the question correctly, they must do the forfeit. The cup is then taken away.
8. If they answer the question correctly the team scores 4 points. If they do the forfeit they score 2 points. If they fail to do either the other team gains 4 points.
9. The game ends when a team has had all its cups removed.
10. The winning team is the team with most points.
11. As a follow-up, ask students to keep the questions that they couldn't answer in a pile. They then need to use their notes to find the correct answers. Build up a definitive set of answers as a class.
